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CONSTITUTION OF INDIA.

No. RTR. 1385/478/CR. 214/85/MED-14.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 309 of the Constitution of India and in supersession of all existing rules, orders or instruments made in this behalf, the Governor of Maharashtra, is hereby pleased to make the following rules regulating recruitment to the posts of Senior Scientific Officer, Class-I and Scientific Officer, Class-II, in General State Services, in the Drug Control Laboratory under the Food and Drug Administration of the Medical Education and Drugs Department of the Government of Maharashtra, namely :—

1. These rules may be called the Senior Scientific Officer, Class-I, and Scientific Officer, Class-II, General State Services, in the Drug Control Laboratory under the Food and Drug Administration (Recruitment) Rules, 1988.

2. In these rules, unless the context requires otherwise,—

(a) "Degree" means degree of a statutory University recognised by the appointing authority for purposes of these rules;

(b) "Drug Control Laboratory" means Drug Control Laboratory under the Food and Drug Administration of Government;

(c) "Government" means the Government of Maharashtra.

3. Appointment to the post of Senior Scientific Officer, General State Services, in the Drug Control Laboratory shall be made by promotion of a suitable person on the basis of seniority subject to fitness from amongst the persons holding the post of Scientific Officer, General State Services, in the Drug Control Laboratory having experience of not less than five years in that post.

4. Appointment to the post of Scientific Officer, General State Service, Class-II, in the Drug Control Laboratory shall be made either,—

(a) by promotion of a suitable person on the basis of seniority subject to fitness from amongst the persons holding the post of Analytical Chemist in Drugs Control Laboratory, having not less than three years experience as prescribed in sub-clause (iii) of clause (b) of this rule; or

(b) by nomination from amongst candidates who,—

(i) unless already in the service of Government, are not more than 35 years of age;

(ii) possess—

(A) a degree in Medicine, Science, Pharmacy or Pharmaceutical Chemistry; or

(B) a post-graduate degree in Science, Pharmacy or Pharmaceutical Chemistry; and

(ii) have experience, gained after acquiring such qualification, of not less than three years, in testing of Drugs in a Laboratory under the control of Government Analyst appointed under the Drugs and Cosmetics Act, 1940 (23 of 1940) :

Provided that, the age limit may be relaxed by Government on the recommendation of the Maharashtra Public Service Commission in favour of candidates possessing exceptional qualifications or experience, or both.

5. Appointment to the post of Scientific Officer, General State Service, Class-II by promotion and nomination shall be made in the ratio of 50:50:

Provided that, if in the opinion of the Government, the exigencies of service so requires, Government may, after consultation with the Commission, wherever necessary, make appointment to the post in relaxation of the percentage prescribed under this rule, for recruitment by promotion and nomination.

6. A person appointed to the posts by nomination shall be on probation for a period of two years.

7. A person appointed to the post whether by promotion or by nomination shall be required to pass examinations in Hindi and Marathi according to the rules made in that behalf, unless he has already passed or has been already exempted from passing these examinations.

8. A medical graduate selected for appointment to the post mentioned in rule 4 shall be required to get himself registered under the Maharashtra Medical Council Act, 1965 (Mah. XLVI of 1965), before joining the post, unless he has already so registered or his name is borne on the Indian Medical Registrar maintained under the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 (102 of 1956).
